TEXAS TAKES ON CANCER

Grantee Progress Report Update

66 Projects, \$39,745,135 Awarded

In first 17 months of reporting, 53* projects report:

- Over **77,000** people received education, outreach, navigation services
- Over **46,000** people screened
 - **27,381** (58%) never before screened
- **2,718** abnormal screening results
- **244** precursors detected (**81** never before screened)
- **166** cancers detected (**53** never before screened)

* 13 projects awarded July 2011 will begin reporting in FY12

Goal 7: Increase proportion of early stage diagnosis through screening and early detection to reduce deaths from breast cancer

Objectives

- 7.1 Increase proportion of women who receive breast cancer screening according to national guidelines
- 7.2 Reduce the rate of late stage diagnosis of breast cancer

Targets:

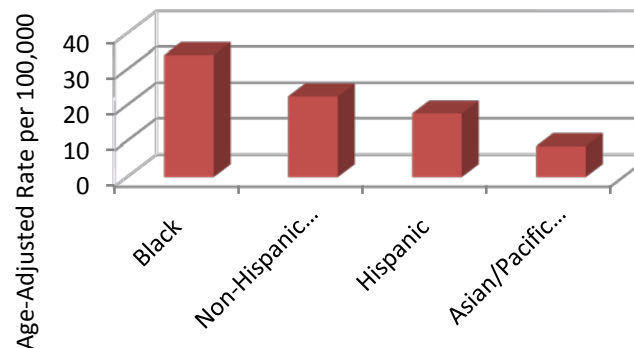
By 2016, 80% of women will have had mammogram in last 2 years

- Increase of 14 % over 2010 baseline.
- Reverse direction!

STRATEGIC ACTIONS: *Examples*

- Increase and improve access to care by reducing structural and financial barriers.
- Evidence-based strategies may include:
 - Increasing hours of operation.
 - Increasing access to transportation services.
- Promote the provision of screening services through medical homes, accountable-care organizations and other emerging models of healthcare delivery.
